Bluetopia Suites

Just a short drive from Mykonos port, this boho haven is one of the newest hotels to open on the island, offering secluded luxury close to the island's hotspots. Perched on the sleepy hills of Tourlous, overlooking Agios Stefanos beach, this boutique hotel features 17 one-bedroom suites, curated with relaxing earth-toned interiors, Mykonian stone walls, handcrafted wooden furnishings and natural decorations that honor its surroundings. Rain is normally not an issue, but the rainiest seasons are from October to April, with the weather idyllic for a beach holiday from mid-May to October.
